The UCAS application process

5 course choices

You may only apply to Oxford OR Cambridge

If you are applying for Medicine, Dentistry or Veterinary Medicine, your 5th choice must be a different subject

MAKE SURE YOU CHECK IF ADMISSIONS TESTS ARE REQURIED FOR YOUR COURSE. YOU HAVE TO DO THE UKCAT FOR MEDICINE/DENTISTRY

15th January 2020

Applications completed for the majority of courses

30th June 2020 Applications received after 30 June are entered into clearing

October Half term – internal deadline

Personal Statement

- Part of your UCAS application
- 4000 characters written by YOU about YOU
- Your opportunity to sell yourself to the tutor
- Includes skills, experiences, interests
- Helps universities to select their students using something other than just grades
- Can be stressful!





- Predicted grades from every department
- Departments have been asked to write references ask your teachers as well.

- Your UCAS form comes to Mrs Kar
- Make an appointment to see Mrs Kar and we send it off together
