Answering the Question

- You should address the focus in the question in either your point or intention. You do not have to take the thing you are being asked about and word it as (thing you are being asked about) is presented as...
- Your point should always have the writer's name; how a character/setting or other thing from the text is presented and when in the text it is presented that way

Point Wording Options

- The writer presents ...as...when...
- The writer presents ...as...when... therefore they are.../they are to some extent.../they are not necessarily...
- The writer explores ... by presenting as... when...
- The writer uses ...to present...as...when...

Intention

• Your intention should be **outside the text**, meaning that you are saying why a thing is presented in a certain way- what is it allowing the writer to say about real life issues
