



St. Benedict









St. Benedict founded monasteries throughout Italy. He introduced the Rule of St. Benedict for all monks to follow.







Who was Saint Benedict?

St. Benedict was born at Nursia in Umbria, Italy in the 5th century. Coming from a rich Italian family, his life was full of adventure and wonderful events. As a boy, he was sent to Rome to study in the public schools but was troubled by the bad behaviour of the other students.

Benedict left the city and went looking for a place where he could be alone with God. He found the right spot. It was a cave in the mountain of Subiacco. Benedict spent three years there alone.

After three years, people started coming to Benedict. They wanted to learn how to become holy. He became the leader of some men who asked for his help. He became the Abbot of their monastery.

Later, Benedict became the leader of many good monks. He started twelve monasteries. Then he went to Monte Casino where he built his most well-known monastery. It was here that St. Benedict wrote the wonderful rules for the Benedictine order.
