## PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

Personal Development at St Benedict's is part of everything we do. ## **RELATIONSHIPS**

Learning can only take place when there is a strong professional relationship between the teacher and the pupil.

Everything we do here at St Benedict's is geared towards pupils learning right from wrong and taking responsibility for their actions.

We instil into our pupils three key phrases:

#### Be READY, Be RESPECTFUL, Be SAFE.

These three phrases are the cornerstone of our school code of conduct.

As a parent you will recognise that being ready to learn, being respectful to peers and keeping yourself safe as the elements of a successful learning experience.

## **GETTING IT RIGHT**

When a pupil does something wrong, there is a consequence of restorative justice. When a pupil follows the rules and tries their best they will receive a reward.

Our rewards system is based on attaining achievement points. The more achievement points gained the more rewards that will be given. Our rewards system is based around our virtues medal.

# STUDENT SUPPORT

Our school is fully inclusive and students with additional needs are included in all aspects of life here.

All staff, including the learning support department, work with those students who need additional support within school either academically, socially, emotionally or physically.

This support is largely offered within mainstream classrooms to ensure that all students are able to access inclusive learning and quality first teaching at an appropriate level. Tasks may be modified or scaffolded for individual students. Students are also supported at social times if appropriate.

Some of our students have a wide range of needs, including difficulties in reading, writing, spelling, numeracy, understanding, communication, self esteem, self confidence, behaviour, hearing impairments, visual impairments, co-ordination, mobility, learning difficulties, autism, physical and medical difficulties.

## **Bridging Classes**

As a school we recognise that there are a small number of pupils who transfer to us, who have been highlighted as requiring additional support by our primary feeder schools. We understand that for some pupils the jump to secondary is a very stressful time both academically and emotionally.

At St Benedict's we have well established Year 7 Bridging Classes, taught by an experienced primary trained teacher, who delivers the core curriculum to a small number of pupils at an appropriate level.

On top of this, we also offer additional activities such as horse riding, Forest School and Farm Life to students who may benefit from non-classroom based activities.









# **OUR FACILITIES**

Since 2019 we have been based at Campus Whitehaven in our new £33m school, which was individually designed (not an 'off-the-shelf' model!)

We have fabulous state of the art facilities including a full size, floodlit 4G astroturf pitch, sportshall & activity studio, pool, new grass pitches and tennis courts.

We also have fabulous new science labs, library, music rooms, performance space, design

technology facilities and IT suites.













## TRANSITION PROGRAMME

Here at St Benedicts, our transition programme begins early in Year 6. The transition from Primary to Secondary school is a significant educational step for our young people, it is both exciting and daunting in equal measures.

This is why at St Benedict's we have a dedicated 'Transition Manager' who leads an experienced team of staff to ensure families are supported throughout the whole admissions process.

Our aim is to ensure parents are informed and students are optimistic and excited about becoming part of our St Benedict's community.

We have an extensive transition programme which commences in the summer term of Year 5 and offers families continued support until students are fully integrated into the care of our excellent Year 7 Pastoral team in September.
